**FOH Challenge Prelim entries Area Qualifier closing date 8<sup>th</sup> February**

**FOH Challenge BRC Area Entry Form closing date 18<sup>th</sup> February**

**Unaffiliated Horse Trials** classes are open to all. Dressage will be on grass down by the race course. Show Jumping will consist of a course of 7-10 show jumps on grass followed by 15 – 18 XC fences. Both phases will be timed, 325mpm SJ, 450mpm (90) and 475mpm (100).

### **CLASS**

- 1 Horse Trials Open(100) – ***Open to all £50 per rider***  
(BE100 Dressage Test 106 SJ 95cm & XC 100cm)
- 2 Horse Trials Novice (90) – ***Open to all £50 per rider***  
(BE90 Dressage Test 92 SJ 85cm & 90XC)
- 3 Horse Trials (80) – ***Open to all £50 per rider***  
(BE90 Dressage Test 95 SJ 80cm & XC 80cm)

**FOH Challenge BRC Area Qualifier** classes comprises of a course of 7-10 show jumps on grass followed **immediately** by 15 – 18 XC fences. Both phases will be timed, 325mpm SJ, 450mpm (90) and 475mpm (100).

- 4 FOH Challenge Junior Open Teams & Individuals (SJ 95cm & XC 100cm)
- 5 FOH Challenge Senior Open Teams & Individuals (SJ 95cm & XC 100cm)
- 6 FOH Challenge Junior Novice Teams & Individuals (SJ 85cm XC 90cm)
- 7 FOH Challenge Senior Novice Teams & Individuals (SJ 85cm XC 90cm)
- 8 FOH Challenge Junior Novice Pairs (SJ 85cm XC 90cm)
- 9 FOH Challenge Senior Novice Pairs (SJ 85cm XC 90cm)

**All Riding Clubs must provide at least one helper per team/pair/individual, for the day or 2 helpers for half a day. Team Managers will need to provide helpers details on your entry form and specify a preferred job and experience so that we can match people to the appropriate job.**

#### **Entry Fees**

Class 1, 2 & 3 £50 per rider

Class 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 & 9 £35 per rider (£140 per team & £70 per pair)

**No extra costs on the day, Paramedic fee is included in the entry fee.**

**Medical armbands are compulsory for ALL competitors.**

**You must provide your own number bib on the day.**

**Competition Notes:** For the avoidance of doubt, competitors shall understand that the rules and conditions of entry (listed below) are the sole terms under which the Swindon & District Riding Club (SDRC) organises competitions. Competitors shall not enter SDRC events unless they have read, understood and fully accepted these terms.

**Cross Country Course open for walking between 1pm – 4pm on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> March.**

## SDRC General Rules and Conditions of Entry

- All classes will be run in accordance with Official Rules for all British Riding Clubs' Competitions (rules available via BHS website)
- It shall be deemed a condition of entry that neither the organisers nor landowners nor their agents shall be held responsible for any loss, injury, damage to competitors, onlookers, their property, servants or horses or ponies, howsoever caused.
- No water on site so please bring your own.
- Horses and ponies shall be 5 years of age or older at the closing date for entry.
- Horses may compete in one class only. Riders may enter a maximum of two horses per class.
- Correct dress shall be worn.  
Everyone mounted, whether competing or not, shall wear a hard hat to at least the minimum standard (EN1384), with a harness properly adjusted and fastened. Failure to do so will incur elimination.  
Hard hats to specification PAS015:1998 or ASTM F1163 and BSEN14572:2005 are considered to offer greater protection than EN1384.  
Skullcaps must be worn with a silk, which may be coloured for cross country.  
**HATS with a FIXED PEAK ARE NOT PERMITTED for CROSS COUNTRY.**  
Hair must be secured in a hair net or in such way that it does not hang lower than the shoulder line.  
Jewellery or any items worn in facial or body piercings are not permitted.  
Chaps or half-chaps may not be worn but black or brown polished leather gaiters with matching boots are permitted.  
**Dressage** Gloves are compulsory.  
**Show Jumping** Body protectors are strongly recommended.  
**Cross Country** A Body Protector to BETA standard Class 3 (Purple Label) is compulsory.  
It is recommended that body protectors are worn as fitted.  
**Medical Armbands are compulsory and MUST BE WORN ON THE RIDER'S ARM.**  
**You will need to bring your own number bib on the day.**  
Watches capable of being started, stopped and recording time elapsed are forbidden.  
HATCAMS – Permission from the Secretary must be obtained prior to the day of the event.
- The organisers reserve the right in the light of prevailing circumstances to cancel the event, alter classes, judges, times, prizes or any other published information.
- In all cases the Judge's decision is final. Any objection shall be accompanied by a deposit of £20 and within half an hour of the incident. The deposit will be returned only if the objection is upheld.
- Refund of entry fees will be made only on production of a vet or doctor's certificate, except in the event of cancellation when all fees will be refunded less £5 to cover non-recoverable costs.
- In the event of any dispute which cannot be satisfactorily resolved, SDRC may, at its option, agree to a full or partial refund of the competitor's entry fees. For the avoidance of doubt claims for consequential liability, expenses or other payments shall in no circumstances be accepted.
- A competitor may not, under penalty of elimination, compete on a horse that has practised over any of the obstacles at the venue for one week prior to the competition.
- DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON A SHORT LEAD at ALL TIMES** including walking the cross country course.
- Competitors must report to the steward 10 minutes before their given start time for each phase.
- In the event of elimination on the Cross Country, for reasons other than a fall of the horse or two falls of the rider, competitors may proceed on the course but shall not obstruct other competitors.
- For the avoidance of doubt and unless explicitly stated to the contrary, medical facilities on the showground will be limited to standard NHS accident & emergency callout.
- Any veterinary services utilised (including horse transportation, accommodation or legal disposal of deceased animals) shall be charged to and paid by the competitor. SDRC does not guarantee that there will be immediate access to a horse ambulance on the showground. Unless otherwise stated, SDRC does not guarantee that there will be immediate access to veterinary services on the showground.
- Any farrier services utilised shall be charged to and paid for by the competitor. Unless otherwise stated, SDRC does not guarantee that there will be immediate access to a farrier on the showground.
- SDRC does not guarantee that the showground is a secure site. SDRC cannot guarantee that the showground perimeter cannot be breached by runaway animals. It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure, so far as is possible, that runaways cannot occur.

**Health & Safety Policy** The organiser of this event has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health & safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents and shall obey the instructions of the organiser, and all officials and stewards.
