Class 1 – AREA 9 WINTER NOVICE SHOWJUMPING QUALIFIER 70cm

Teams consist of 3 or 4 riders. Each rider jumps two rounds (First round 70cm) the second round is timed and these times are used to determine team placings when faults cannot do this. The best three scores in each round will count for the total score. Teams must be either all Junior or all Senior members.

Class 2 – AREA 9 WINTER NOVICE SHOWJUMPING QUALIFIER 80cm

Teams consist of 3 or 4 riders. Each rider jumps two rounds (First round 80cm) the second round is timed and these times are used to determine team placings when faults cannot do this. The best three scores in each round will count for the total score. Teams must be either all Junior or all Senior members.

Individual rosettes 1-6th in each section - BRC Team rosettes 1-6th in each section

Class 2A – Junior Team Competition

Class 2B – Senior Team Competition

This competition will run under British Riding Club Rules. It is important that all competitors are aware of the rules relating to this competition – please see the current BRC Rule Book and also the BRC Rule Amendments and Changes Document.

SJ1: QUALIFIER FORMAT

Riders jump two rounds. Riders will jump the first round and then the second round separately. The second round will be run as a single phase competition, which will combine the second round and the jump-off. The first half of the course should be set at the second round height, with the second part of the course set at jump-off height. The course should be timed in two parts, with the second half being recorded as the jump-off. If necessary the first half of the round can be timed manually depending on the availability of timing equipment. The jump-off will follow straight on from the first part of the course without stopping. All team and individual members (unless the individual is eliminated in first round) will go forward to the second part of the second round (jump-off) unless eliminated in the first half. The second half of the second round (the jump-off) will be classed as both the team and individual jump-off. An area may choose to run a separate jump-off at the end of the class for individuals and use the second part of the second round as the jump-off for teams only (this will be at the areas discretion and must be relayed to competitors on the schedule).

Should a team member be eliminated before reaching the jump-off phase in the second round they will not continue forward to the jump-off section and the team will continue as a team of three. The Official Steward reserves the right to stop anyone who is in multiple classes if BRC feel the horse's welfare is compromised.

RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. All entries must be made on the official British Riding Clubs Entry Form for the Winter Area Qualifiers.
2. The committee/landowner or anyone acting for these will not be held responsible for any loss/accident to persons, animal or property however caused.
3. Owners and riders enter at their own risk.
4. The judge's decision and that of the official steward is final.
5. Questions about the scoring must be made to the secretary. Objections and appeals to be made in writing, accompanied by a £10.00 deposit to the secretary within 10 minutes of the posting of the results of the class.
6. This competition will run under British Riding Club Rules.
7. Vaccination Certificates: As stated in the rules, all BRC qualifying teams must be prepared to show their horse's passports and complete vaccination records on the day of the competition. Chef D'Equipes should ensure these are correct. Please send a copy of each horse's flu vaccination record with the entries (unless already on Area database). Any incorrect certificates will result in exclusion from the qualifying competition.
8. Entries will not be accepted without the correct fee. Cheques should be payable to 'Bath Riding Club'.
9. In the event of withdrawals, the organisers regret that they cannot refund entry fees after the close of entries.
10. Competitors must follow the instructions of stewards at all times.
11. All horses and or ponies must be 4yrs or over.
12. Only persons and/or horses competing may use the warm up facilities. Competitors may only warm up in the designated areas. Lunging is not permitted.
13. Horses may not be left unattended tied to horseboxes or trailers. As a courtesy to the landowner please clear all droppings / hay. Park where requested by parking stewards.
14. Competitors must wear the correct hats, dress and footwear as per BRC rules:
Hard hats must be worn and chin strap fastened by all riders when mounted.
All competitors must have a BRC Official hat tag. Failure to do so will result in elimination.
15. **Health and Safety** - The organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and Officials and Stewards. Paramedics are on site for this competition.
16. **Legal Liability** - Horse / pony sports can be dangerous, and animals are unpredictable. Neither West Wilts Equestrian Centre or Bath Riding Club nor any person acting on their behalf, or the landowners can accept any liability for the loss, damage, accident or injury to any person or property. It is a condition of entry that each entrant agrees to indemnify the above persons against any legal action arising from such an incident.

All persons attending the show will be deemed to have accepted these rules and conditions.
